### Free guides for visitors

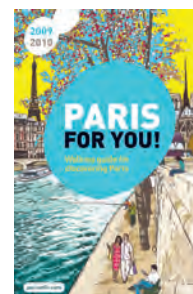
The Bureau offers visitors practical, thematic and complimentary publications. The aim: to help them make the most of their stay and inspire them to explore Paris further.

- **The Paris city map**, in 10 languages (French, English, Spanish, Portuguese, Italian, German, Russian, Chinese, Japanese and Korean), boasts a detailed map and 13 sections on a range of practical subjects including transport, services, health and safety, accommodation, culture, entertainment and shopping to help visitors travel around Paris with ease and see the sights of their choice.



- The French-English guidebook *Paris Gourmand/Good food Guide* lists a selection of restaurants, cafes, bars, markets, cooking courses and wine tasting, tea rooms and delicatessens which make Paris the worldwide capital of gastronomy. Whatever their tastes, budget or list of must-tries, visitors will find what they're looking for here, from gourmet dining and classic and regional fare to fooding trends, culinary world tour and everyday food.

## Information centres

The Paris Convention and Visitors Bureau greets the public at its six permanent centres and, in the summer season at seasonal kiosks located in areas of the capital most frequented by tourists. A multilingual team (11 languages spoken) of reception staff gives information and advice to visitors about Paris and the Paris region, and also proposes accommodation bookings, culture and transport passes, tickets, (coach trips, boat trips on the Seine, cabarets, etc.).
